The Children and Youth with Special Health Care Needs (CYSHCN) Program is a comprehensive resource and referral program aimed at positively impacting the lives of children and youth with special health care needs and their families.

The CYSHCN Program assists families with children from birth to twenty-one (21) years of age who have chronic physical, developmental, behavioral, or emotional conditions and require more health-related services.

To be eligible, your child (birth through 21 years old) must have a qualifying medical condition and reside in Ulster County.

Conditions include but are not limited to ADD or ADHD, allergies, anxiety, arthritis/joint problems, asthma, autism or autism spectrum disorder. behavioral/conduct problem, blood disorders, Cerebral Palsy, Cystic Fibrosis, depression, developmental delay, diabetes, Down Syndrome, epilepsy/seizure disorder, genetic or inherited condition, head injury, hearing problem, heart problem, intellectual disability, learning difficulty, migraines, other mental health condition, muscular dystrophy, sickle cell anemia, speech or language disorder, substance use disorder, Tourette Syndrome, and vision problem.

CYSHCN Case Managers can:

- Conduct an individualized needs assessment.
- Connect families to support networks that understand the challenges of caring for children and youth with special health care needs.
- Provide technical assistance to improve information and referral services.
- Link families to community-based agencies or service providers that can help address unmet needs.
- Provide youth ages 14-21 and their families with information about the transition into adult health care.
